Carers Leeds has beaten more than 400 organisations from all over the UK to be one of the 10 winners of the 2017 GSK IMPACT Awards, a national award that recognises excellence in charities improving health and wellbeing in their communities.

Carers Leeds is committed to improving the lives of the city's unpaid carers. We are here, based in Leeds city centre, to offer carers confidential one-to-one and group support, as well as advice over the phone and online.

Carers Leeds has played a key role in reshaping local services around the needs of carers. In 2014, we became the single point of access to services for carers in Leeds, which had previously been divided between five separate organisations. Carers now have just one telephone number to remember - 0113 380 4300 - and can access a greater range of services.

As a team we are determined to reach out to different groups of carers and to tailor our support to the diverse communities in the city. Carers Leeds has established partnerships with Mental Health Services, Gypsy and Traveller Communities, Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic groups, The Alzheimer's Society, Age UK, Forward Leeds (drug and alcohol service), Leeds Hospitals and GP Practices across the city.

Lisa Weaks, Head of Third Sector at The King's Fund, said: 'As more and more people take on caring responsibilities, organisations like Carers Leeds provide crucial support. Carers Leeds has demonstrated excellent leadership in developing new and improved approaches to meeting the needs of carers. By becoming the single point of access for carers in

Leeds, it's helping people navigate a complex system and receive the advice and support they need. It's a very impressive accomplishment.'

One Treadmil, One Grandma and One Marathon...

Jane, 67 year old Grandma and Carers Leeds Volunteer set herself the challenge of running 42.195 Kilometres over 5 days during Dementia Awareness Week to complete a fundraising May-rathon for a Carers Leeds Dementia Café. This is her story...

"My journey with Carers Leeds started back in the early Leeming House days. My history with Dementia Cafes began when myself and two colleagues hosted the first Dementia Cafe to open in Leeds. My story with people living with dementia and their carers covers 30 years of my working life.

The effort and energy I put into training and completing the May-rathon is nothing compared to the effort and energy required to get though each day if you are a person with dementia or their carer."

"Training started on Monday 27th March when I huffed and puffed my way to 3 kilometres on a treadmill at Scott Hall Leisure Centre. Slowly over 7 weeks I increased my speed and distance.

There were days when I didn't want to get up...but I did!

There were days when I didn't want to go to Scott Hall Leisure Centre...but I did!

There were days when I wanted to get off the treadmill...but I didn't!

Dementia Awareness Week dawned. Monday 15th May. 8.5km. Now or never. Monday Tuesday 8.65km, Wednesday 8.70km, Thursday 8.74 km and finally Friday 8.03km. I DID IT. In fact I over did it!"

"Encouragement and support from family, friends, Dementia Cafe customers. Carers Leeds staff. members and staff at Scott Hall Leisure Centre all kept me going for which I thank them. Oh ves



and a small matter of around £800 sponsorship money I have raised so far for the Dementia Cafe."


